



After Trimming

- A. Shoulders square and in line with forearms and knees straight down to the fetlock joints through the center of the hoof.
 - B. The back is square and in line with the stifle, the hocks and the fetlock joints through the center of the hoof.
 - C. The lines depict proper angles of the shoulder and the rear leg along with the hoof and the pastern angles.
- ❖ When a horse's feet are trimmed properly and the horse is standing up straight and true you should be able to see these lines of angles on your horse. A wood yardstick or broom handle will help you to gauge your horse's confirmation after the feet have been trimmed.
